4:1-4 EVENTS WHICH FOLLOW THE RAPTURE

4:1, After this I looked - Μετὰ ταῦτα εἶδον, -

And behold, a door was opened in heaven - καὶ ἰδού, θύρα ἀνεψγμένη ἐν τῷ οὐρανῷ - A door for passing from one place to another / John 10:9 / It is time for the final call of the redeemed - the Church.

There are three doors in the revelation:

- 3:8, The Gospel witness
- 3:20, Opportunity for salvation
- 4:1. Removal of the saved

And the first voice which I heard was as it were of a trumpet talking with me - καὶ ἡ φωνὴ ἡ πρώτη ἣν ἤκουσα ὡς σάλπιγγος λαλούσης μετ' ἐμοῦ -

I Cor. 15:51-53,

Which said, Come up hither - έγων, Άνάβα ὧδε -

And I will shew thee things which must be hereafter - καὶ δείξω σοι ἃ δεῖ γενέσθαι μετὰ ταῦτα. -

4:2, and immediately I was in the spirit – Καὶ εὐθέως ἐγενόμην ἐν πνεύματι· -

and, behold, a throne was set in heaven - καὶ ἰδού, θρόνος ἔκειτο ἐν τῷ οὐρανῷ -

and one sat on the throne - καὶ ἐπὶ τὸν θρόνον καθήμενος -

4:3, And he that sat was to look upon – και ο καθημενος ην ὅμοιος ὁράσει -

like a jasper and sardine stone. - λίθω ἰάσπιδι καὶ σαρδίω - brilliance and glory

and there was a rainbow round about the throne - καὶ ἶρις κυκλόθεν τοῦ θρόνου - we see a semi-circle, a reminder of the promise of Noah. In Heaven it is a complete circle about the throne, a pledge of God's faithfulness

in sight like unto an emerald - ὁμοίως ὅρασις σμαραγδίνων. -

4:4, and round about the throne were four and twenty seats - Καὶ κυκλόθεν τοῦ θρόνου θρόνοι εἴκοσι τέσσαρες -

And upon the seats I saw four and twenty elders sitting - καὶ ἐπὶ τοὺς θρόνους τοὺς εἴκοσι τέσσαρας πρεσβυτέρους καθημένους, -

clothed in white raiment; - περιβεβλημένους ἐν ἱματίοις λευκοῖς -

and they had on their heads crowns of gold - καὶ ἐπὶ τὰς κεφαλὰς αὐτῶν στεφάνους χρυσοῦς - Who are they? cf. 4:9-10 / It may be a picture of all believers who are kings and priests before their God: I Pet. 2:4-5; Rev. 1:5-6

4:5, And out of the throne proceeded lightnings and thunderings and voices: - Καὶ ἐκ τοῦ θρόνου ἐκπορεύονται ἀστραπαὶ καὶ φωναὶ καὶ βρονταί. -

and there were seven lamps of fire burning before the throne, - Καὶ ἑπτὰ λαμπάδες πυρὸς καιόμεναι ἐνώπιον τοῦ θρόνου αὐτοῦ -

which are the seven Spirits of God. - αἴ εἰσιν ἑπτὰ πνεύματα τοῦ θεοῦ - God is preparing to bring righteous judgment on a sinful world / lightning /Ps. 29:3-5; Ex. 19:16-18 / God does not judge the world today in the same way for He on a throne of grace / at the beginning of the tribulation He is on a throne of judgment and it is "justice day" on earth.

"seven lamps of fire burning before the throne" the seven spirits of God / characteristic of perfection - these lamps show the righteous character of God to search out sins which are upon the earth and to judge. Seven lamps is characteristic of the Holy Spirit: Rev. 1:4; 3:1; 5:6 / seven fold fullness or completeness: omniscience and omnipotence; also shows His judicial character: fire - 2 Thess. 1:7-8. Holy Spirit: A dove at Christ's baptism, cloven tongues of fire at Pentecost, and seven lamps in the Revelation. All these are a means of informing men of His presence, normally invisible.

4:6, And before the throne there was a sea of glass like unto crystal: - καὶ ἐνώπιον τοῦ θρόνου ὡς θάλασσα ὑαλίνη, ὁμοία κρυστάλλῳ. - Fixed state of purity and holiness, no need for the redeemed to be cleansed as in O.T. days

<mark>and in the midst of the throne, and round about the throne</mark>, - Καὶ ἐν μέσῳ τοῦ θρόνου καὶ κύκλῳ τοῦ θρόνου -

were four beasts full of eyes before and behind. - τέσσαρα ζῷα γέμοντα ὀφθαλμῶν ἔμπροσθεν καὶ ὅπισθεν. "four beasts" - living ones / in the midst and surrounding the throne / 20X in Revelation, created being standing ready to serve God. Full of eyes to seeing all things with accuracy.

4:7, and the first beast was like a lion - Lion, Matthew, King - Judah

And the second beast was like a calf - Mark, Servant – Ephraim

And the third beast had a face as a man - Luke, Son of God - Reuben

And the fourth beast was like a flying eagle - John, God the Son, Deity - Dan

4:8, And the four beasts had each of them six wings about him; and they were full of eyes within: and they rest not day and night, -

saying, Holy, holy, holy, Lord God Almighty, - Ἄγιος, ἄγιος, ἄγιος, κύριος ὁ θεὸς ὁ παντοκράτωρ - Trinity - Isa. 6:3 / Sound praise and execute judgment before God's wrath is poured out, His holiness is magnified - because of His holiness sin must be judged

LORD GOD ALMIGHTY holiness deity eternality κύριος ὁ θεὸς ὁ παντοκράτωρ

which was, and is, and is to come. - ὁ ἦν καὶ ὁ ὢν καὶ ὁ ἐρχόμενος. –
Pres Ptc. Impf. Pres Ptc. Literally: He who is, and was, and is coming.

4:10, The 24 elders fall before the Him that is on throne and worship Him, that liveth forever and ever; then cast their crowns before the throne. They laying aside their glory and rewards, to give Him glory that He alone is worthy to receive.

4:11, Thou art worthy, O Lord, - Ἄξιος εἶ, κύριε -

to receive glory and honour and power: - λαβεῖν τὴν δόξαν καὶ τὴν τιμὴν καὶ τὴν δύναμιν

 $extit{for thou hast created all things},$ - ὅτι σὺ ἔκτισας τlpha πάντα -

and for thy pleasure they are and were created. - καὶ διὰ τὸ θέλημά σου εισι καὶ ἐκτίσθησαν. - Worship is not confined to praise, which is an emphasis on His attributes, but it is absolute surrender of all that we have, in order to get a vision of the greatness of God.
